LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear friends and supporters of RMFI,

The culmination of each year provides us all with the opportunity to reflect on the people and events that have made a profound impact on our lives. As I contemplate RMFI's 2022 season, the two words that continue to come to mind are gratitude and resilience. There is no question that 2022 was a year of significant change here at RMFI. As many of you know, we experienced a major transition in our leadership. Longtime RMFI Executive Director Jennifer Peterson left her position at RMFI in October for an amazing opportunity with the U.S. Forest Service. We are forever grateful to Jen for her dedication to RMFI's mission and for the impact she has had on us as individuals and for the community. We also saw several of our key program staff depart to explore new places and opportunities. We thank them all for the mark they have left on this organization and we look forward to seeing all the incredible things they will accomplish.

2022 was an incredibly successful and historic year. We employed the largest staff in RMFI history, completed the most project workdays in RMFI history, and worked at more project locations than ever before. We increased volunteer engagement by 40% compared to 2021, and nearly 440% compared to 2020. We hosted the 21st annual Earth Corps Program, completed the 10th annual Pikes Peak Regional Crew Leader training program, and secured long term funding for a number of important projects. We developed several exciting new partnerships with the City of Manitou Springs and the University of Colorado – Colorado Springs. We returned to the Dixon Trail in Cheyenne Mountain State Park, a RMFI legacy project site, to build upon the work of RMFI founder Mark Hesse. We completed over 255 stewardship workdays in Colorado Springs parks and open spaces, a feat that could not be accomplished without support provided by the TOPS program through the City of Colorado Springs and the Resilient Communities grant through Great Outdoors Colorado.

Change is often daunting and always challenging, but the support from each of you has helped see us through. We are grateful to every partner, donor, volunteer, event-goer, hiker, biker, rider and well-wisher who have contributed a piece of yourself towards our mission. The strength of this organization has always been in our community, and we thank each and every one of you for your support. See you in 2023!

Integrity in actions. We are committed to holding ourselves to the highest degree of responsibility and accountability.

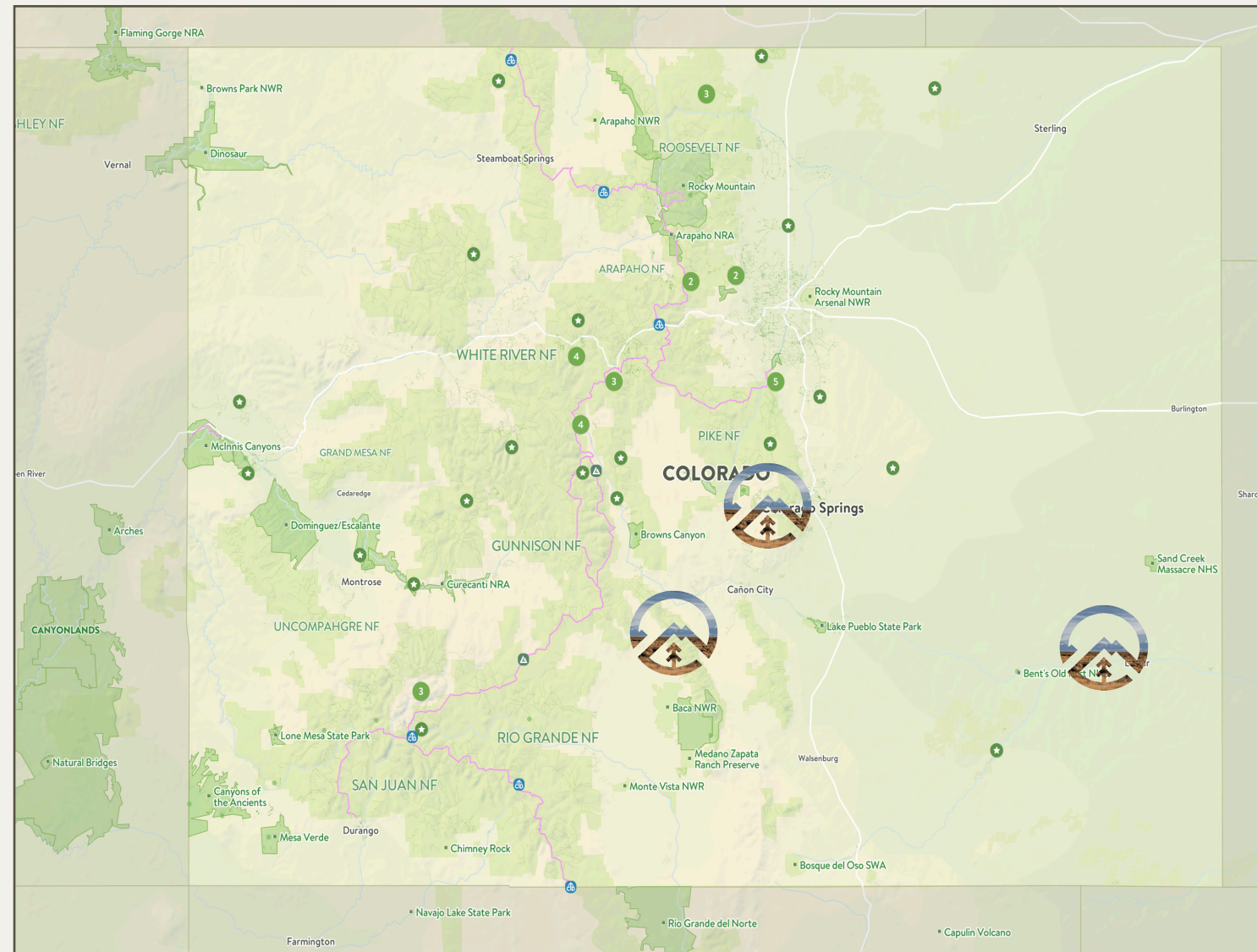
Courage. In furthering our mission, we will have the courage to undertake difficult and complex projects.

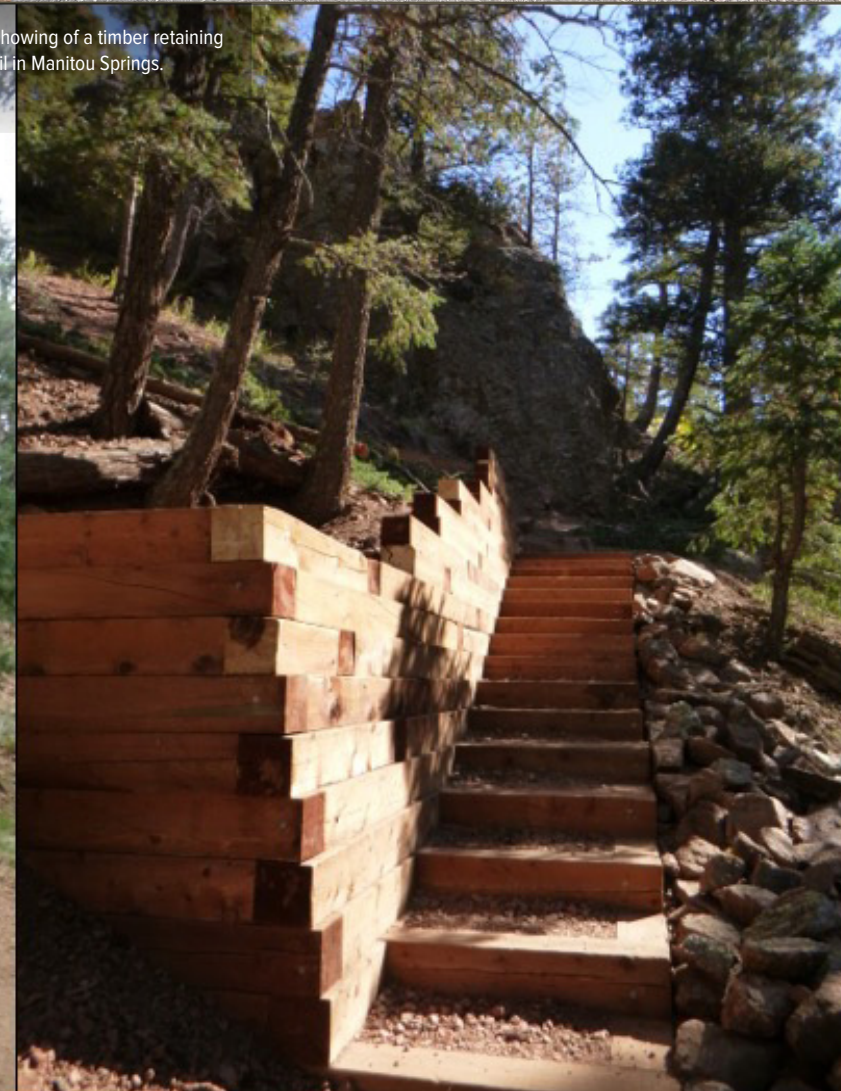

PROJECT HIGHLIGHT



Dixon Trail maintenance with Cheyenne Mountain State Park

In 2022, RMFI partnered with Cheyenne Mountain State Park to perform some critical maintenance to the upper section of the Dixon Trail. RMFI has a long history of stewardship in the Park. In 2013, RMFI founder Mark Hesse, working under his firm Wildscapes Planning and Design, LLC and under contract with Cheyenne Mountain State Park, completed a comprehensive Trail Development and Construction Plan for the design and construction of a trail system in the Top of the Mountain (TOM) area of the park. The Dixon Trail, which provides access to the Top of the Mountain, was completed in 2018 through a partnership between Cheyenne Mountain State Park, the Friends of Cheyenne Mountain State Park (FoCMSP), Mile High Youth Corps, Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado, RMFI and many other partners and stakeholders.

We were thrilled to return to this legacy site in 2022 to honor Mark and his impact on the community. Our crews completed 32 workdays on the trail, rebuilding a number of eroded and defunct switchbacks. We also joined forces with the FoCMSP Trail Dogs and many community volunteers on the project. The Trail Dogs and volunteers assisted with the transportation of material and helped construct retaining and erosion control structures.

The Dixon Trail project was one of the most physically challenging projects RMFI undertook in 2022, which made it all the more rewarding to see completed. We hope that next time you are out on the Dixon enjoying the challenging hike, you think of Mark and all of the people that helped make it one of the most beloved trails in the region.





PROJECT HIGHLIGHT



Colorado Springs Trails, Open Space, and Parks (TOPS) Programming

RMFI has a close working relationship with the City of Colorado Springs Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services Department that spans decades. If you enjoy hiking, biking, or horseback riding in one of our city's wonderful parks and open spaces, chances are RMFI has had a hand in taking care of that special place. We are incredibly fortunate to have the honor of stewarding the places that make Colorado Springs one of the best places to live in the country.

The vast majority of our stewardship work on city properties is made possible through the Trails, Open Space, and Parks (TOPS) tax. This .01-cent sales and use tax goes directly towards acquiring new park and open space property (protecting it from future development), building more trails, and maintaining the parks, trails, and open spaces that we already have.

In 2022, RMFI completed 78 stewardship workdays across 4 TOPS properties: Austin Bluffs Open Space, Blodgett Open Space, Red Rock Canyon Open Space, and Stratton Open Space. Highlights of our 2022 field season include the closure and restoration of 8,720 linear feet of illegal trail, 218 square feet of tread armoring, and 3,213.5 linear feet of trail improvements.

RMFI strives to engage our community in all aspects of the work that we do. By activating members of the community, we hope to instill a sense of stewardship that will help ensure the places that we all enjoy are cared for for generations to come. We engaged 124 community volunteers in our TOPS stewardship programming in 2022, and aim to increase that dramatically in 2023.

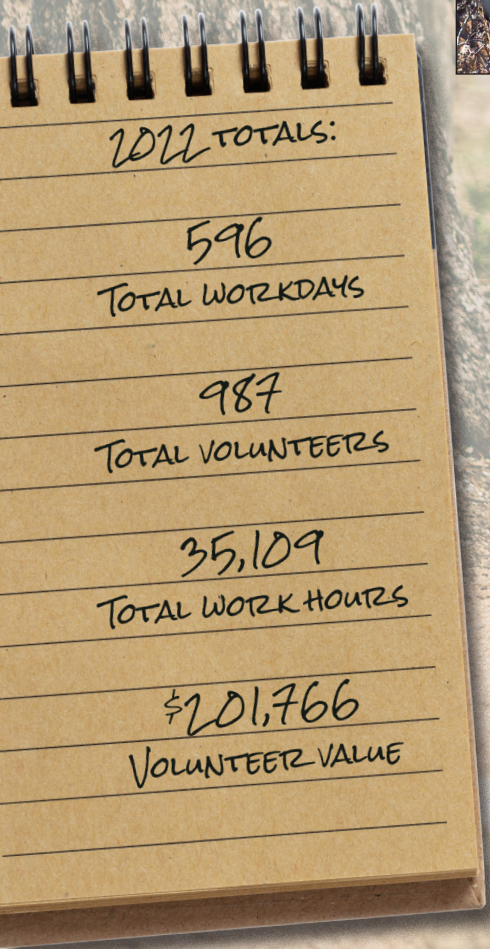

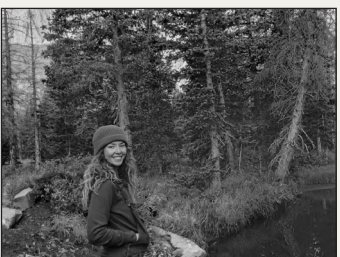

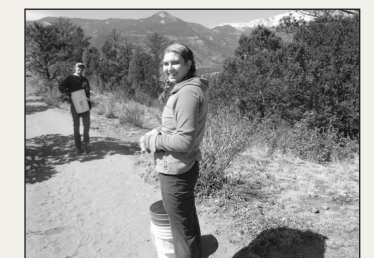

THE ROBERT J. WEGGEL FUND

Robert “Bob” Weggel has long been an avid hiker and backpacker, having trekked two hundred miles to gaze enraptured by Mt. Everest and its vicinity and summited Mt. Whitney and all but nine of Colorado’s 14ers—the first in 1970, the most recent at age 73. He’s also an avid conservationist and trail builder, specializing in rock steps, stepping stones and soil-retention walls. RMFI’s Volunteer Vacation program hosted him in 2006 at South Colony Lakes and subsequently at Lake Como, Kit Carson, and Cheyenne Mountain. In gratitude, in March of 2017 he established RMFI’s first Endowment Fund to help support its conservation and stewardship work.

Bob earned a B.S. degree in physics from MIT, followed by graduate work at Harvard. For thirty-six years he designed magnets for the National Magnet Laboratory at MIT; 1980s editions of The Guinness Book of World Records cite him as co-designer of a magnet that generated the most intense continuous magnetic field in the world. He now is contributing to expeditiously bringing to our energy-hungry world abundant, economical, environmentally-benign electric power from thermonuclear fusion.

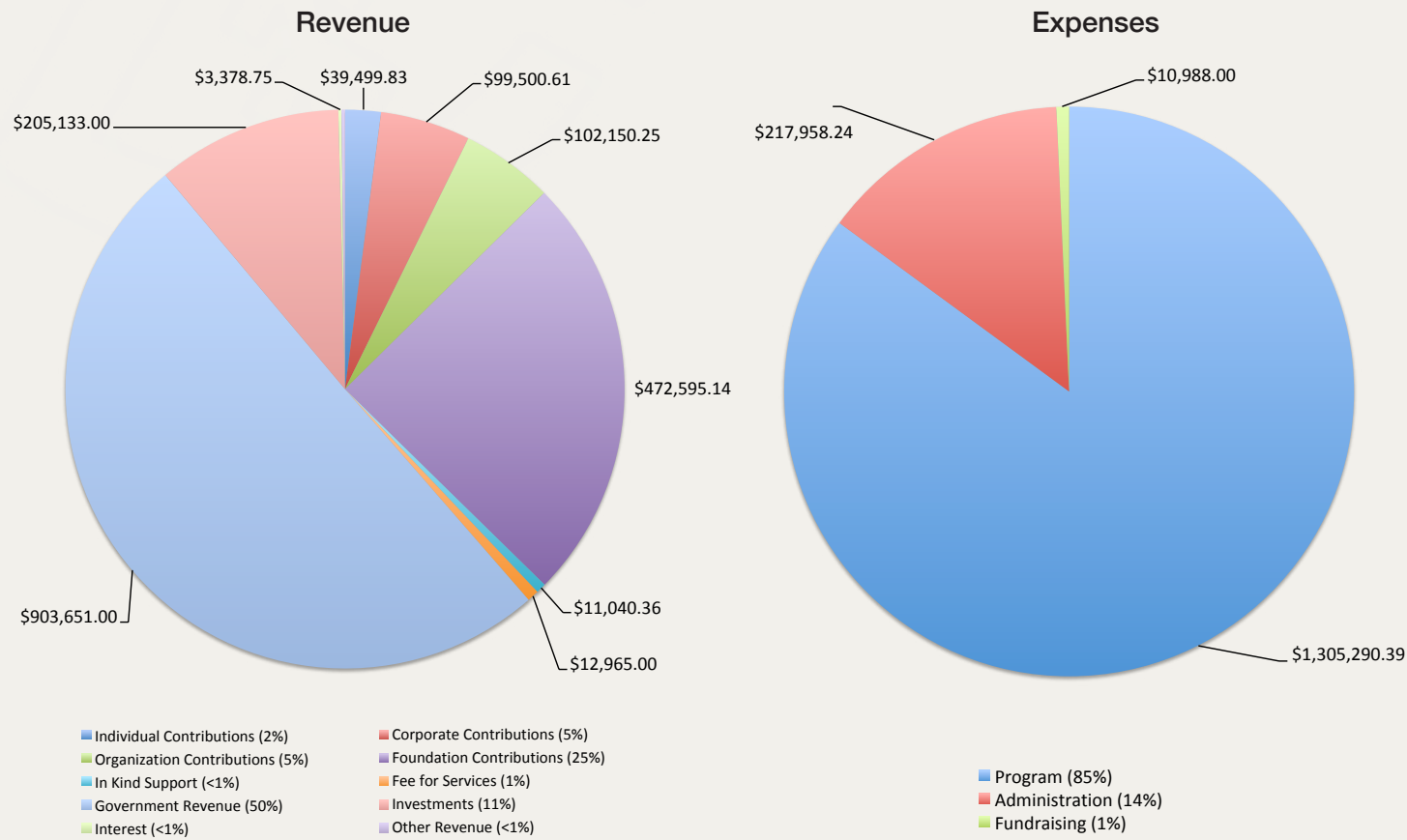

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

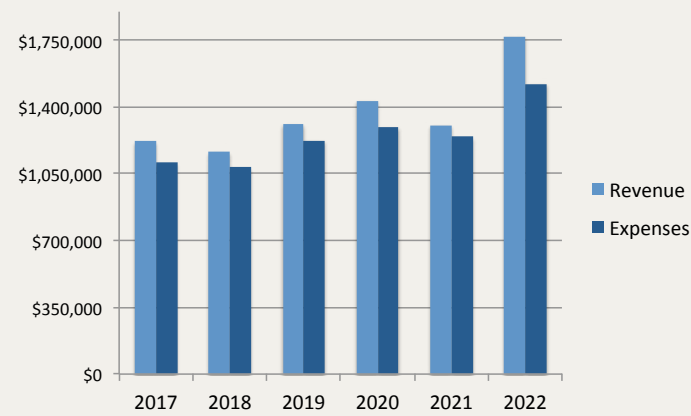

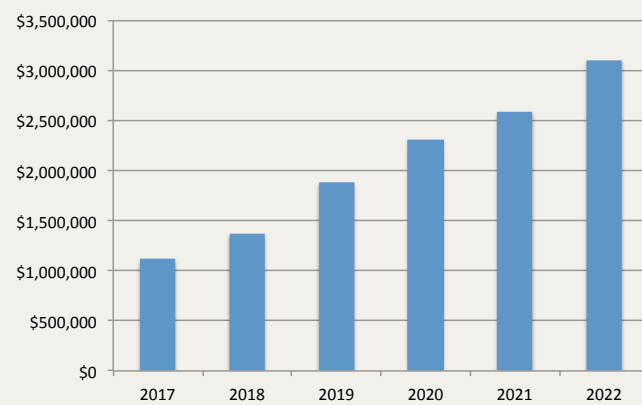
